Earth Rangers Presentation - On October 27th

Internet Safety Presentations

Thank you to our partners at FCSS, The Saffron Centre is pleased to be giving Internet Safety Presentations to students and parents in our community. Here at Aurora Middle School our Grade 5's to 8's will receive the information session on Tuesday September 26th. There will also be a <u>free parent info session</u> that evening from 6pm-8pm at the Bold Center.

The Internet Safety presentations for junior high students are designed to encourage personal integrity and reputation protection with every click. Safety tips are delivered with stories and online examples to emphasize the importance of respect for self and one's future. Students will be shown how to use privacy settings, turn off location settings, and manage friends and followers to protect their personal information. We'll talk about healthy boundaries in all online interactions and to respect self and others. Whether gaming, managing social media profiles, or researching — teens will be encouraged to involve parents and guardians in their online activities to have accountability and help when situations are inappropriate or difficult. Cyber-bullying will be defined and students will learn what to do when they encounter instances of bullying online.







Northern Lights Public Schools is pleased to announce that it now has a communication tool for parents that are consistent from classroom to classroom and school to school. School Messenger will allow all NLPS schools to send messages to parents and/or students by using the contact information they provided to the school when they registered.

This will include <u>automated attendance messages</u> when students aren't at school and their absence hasn't already been reported by a parent or guardian. It will also include general messages from the school and division such as newsletters and invitations to upcoming events. School Messenger allows the division, schools or individual teachers to send messages to parents in a variety of ways, including voice messages to phones, text messages, and emails.

There is also a <u>School Messenger app</u> that will allow teachers to communicate directly with parents/guardians and/or students, individually or in groups. The app will also allow parents or students to indicate which ways they would like to be conacted (email, voice, text), in which circum-stances (general messages, attendance, and emergencies). Through the app, parents will also be able to see all of the messages that have been shared for each of their children. So parents with multiple children, who may be attending different schools, can see all of the messages they have received by simply checking the School Messenger app.

The app also allows users to turn on push notifications in the settings, so they will know immediately when they have received a message.

NLPS has already started training staff on how to use School Messenger for attendance and sending school messages. We hope to complete that training and have School Messenger in use at every school **by the end of September.**

Once School Messenger is in place at the school level, our focus will shift to providing teachers with the training and resources they need to effectively use the classroom communication tools that are available to them through School Messenger. This may take some time and we thank everyone in advance for their patience and cooperation while we work through this process.

What do parents need to do?

There are three things parents can do to help us implement School Messenger more efficiently and effectively: Ensure your contact information is up-to-date at your child's school. You will need to have an email address on file to receive messages via email or through the app, and a cell phone number on file for text messages.

In order to receive text messages, School Messenger requires you to opt in. If you have provided your school with a cell phone number, you will receive a message from School Messenger (it will appear as a short code - a five digit number - on your phone). The message will ask you to text "Y" if you wish to receive text messages from your child's school. We will be enabling text messaging soon, so if your number is on file, you should receive a message within the next couple of weeks.



Download the School Messenger app and create an account. Make sure you use the same email address as the one that you provided to your child's school. The app will allow you to set your contact preferences.



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
