Hands-On Learning at Aurora!

Another terrific week of hands-on, <u>exploratory</u>, <u>inquiry-based</u> learning is in the books, and the smiling faces of students and teachers alike is terrific evidence of a successful return to in-person learning. To the left, students

proudly show off their <u>paper roller coasters</u> -- a <u>Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM)</u> <u>activity</u> that explores the physics of energy and motion. The frog dissection lab (pictured right) covers grade 8 science outcomes in *Unit B: Cells and Systems*; in the lab, students investigated the characteristics of living organisms, body systems,

and the contributing roles of cells, tissues, and organs, and as you can see, the students had a terrific time learning-by-doing. Several students reported being thankful for masking rules for once, as they helped with the odour from the specimens.









Speaking of masking, our Home Ec classes

are very thankful to our generous group of parents of the school council for the addition of several new sewing machines this year.
