




Orange Shirt Day and Terry Fox Run/Walk and Fundraiser! Aurora

COVID-19 Update By the end of last week, Aurora was placed on outbreak status for respiratory illness (see <u>AHS Letter - Outbreak Notification - Aurora Middle School</u>), however there were no reported cases of COVID among Aurora students. Parents received notice because there were reported cases connected to Bus Route 117.



Schedule and Recess Times Update As we notified parents in last week's Thunderbird News and the September PAC meeting, your child may have a slightly different schedule as we adjust some bell times, reduce the number of transitions, increase the transition time for students who are moving to another learning space.

While we had previously met provincial guidelines for cohorting, this change also allows us to take some additional steps to enhance our cohorting of students to help reduce the risk of transmission during recess and lunch. Students will actually have an increase in allotted time for movement, snack, and outside breaks, though some apprehension has arisen with the changes including moving the afternoon outside recess to the morning; this approach makes sense, since our lunch time is later than in previous years



and we can ensure we best align our breaks to avoid any recess conflicts with Vera on the playground.

The morning was long for many students with only a short snack break placed within more than 3.5 hours of instruction. Switching our afternoon outside recess to mid-morning (where the inside snack break was held previously) makes sense with our outside lunch recess being later than it has been in previous years (for cohorting along with outside times for Vera). This, in addition to increasing physical education classes to 45 minutes every day provides a far better experience for students who need to get up and move. The afternoon snack & movement breaks are scheduled by teachers, which allows us to stagger the breaks to avoid congestion in washrooms to further reduce risk of spread. Contact your child's teacher directly if you have questions about how they are breaking up their instructional time in the afternoon and providing their classes with nutrition breaks and movement.

Important Update for Drop-off and Pick-up! Congestion at bus time (particularly after-school pick-up) is being addressed by improving traffic flow. As always, enter the pickup/dropoff lineup at the south end of the school, by the CTS shop and Cafeteria doors. Please note the new signage and direction of flow, and allow enough space in the line at those turning spots to allow buses and parents to flow through. Parents should leave through the south entrance (toward Hwy 36) to avoid a

long lineup of parents attempting to turn toward town at the northeast exit between Vera and AMS. Note the 'No Left Turn" signage as parents exit the pick-up lineup, and "No Parking" signs along the East of our bus lanes. Under no circumstances should parents call students to run across bus lanes at these busy times! We want all our students to get home safely.



Important Dates! Please note that there is **no school** on Thursday September 30 in recognition of the National Day of Truth & Reconciliation! Wednesday September 29 will be Orange Shirt Day at Aurora, as well as our Terry Fox Run. There will also be no school for students on Friday October 8, though parents may be contacted to come in to review Individualized Support Plans for their child on that day.
