## Teen Leadership and Team Building Camp

The camp runs from August 22-26, but people should register soon as it will fill up fast! The cost is \$100 to be paid at the Bold Center (but please let us know if finances are an issue for any families you know and we can figure something out).

Teen Social Club

Similar to our very popular Teen Chillzones, Teen Social Club will be offering weekly sessions where we will participate in lots of outdoor activities like hiking, water activities and even a trip to the new Kinosoo Aerial park! We will also be doing some beading with the Native Friendship Center and an escape room in Cold lake. (I might be more excited for this summer than the teens are!) Social clubs are free with the exception of Kinosoo Ridge, Escape room and beading where a \$20 fee applies. Again please let us know if finances are an issue for any of the families. I have attached the poster for the social club but here is the list either way. The times will vary depending on the activity but we will post the times closer to the events!

- July 7 Water activities by the spray park. Canoes, kayaks and stand-up paddle boards for teens to use. Other activities will be provided on shore as well!
- July 14 Amazing Race in Plamondon. Teens will have to race against other groups to complete as many activities as listed on the Amazing Race Passport. Prizes are available to the groups as well.
- July 21 Escape Room in Cold lake. 5 different rooms to choose from!
- July 28 hiking and BBQ in Sir Winston Churchill Park
- August 4 Indigenous Beading with the Native Friendship Center
- August 11 Stargazing (More info to be announced later on)
- August 18 Kinosoo Ridge Aerial park
